UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

ARTE 4795: Topics in Art Education: Professionalism

This is a course I created. The course examined aspects of professionalism in K-12 teaching, including tackling behavioral issues in the classroom and beyond, communications with parents, administrators, and colleagues, and critical examinations of diplomacy and privilege in teaching challenging content to underserved populations. This upper division course teaches students how they can critically incorporate media literacy and digital technologies into their art teaching practice. University of Arizona
